Albert Cashier, A Civil War Soldier

Albert D. J. Cashier was a Civil War soldier with a secret. As a member of the Illinois 95th, he participated in some 40 battles and skirmishes, traveling nearly 10,000 miles—much of it on foot. He received a veteran's pension at the end of the war and worked for forty years at various jobs, before a broken leg revealed his secret to a select few. At the end of his life, he was buried with full military honors and the unflinching loyalty of his fellow soldiers.

Mary Disseler and Linda Canter will be travelling from Springfield, IL to present information about this unusual Union soldier from Illinois.
